Why Study the Tabernacle?

- 1. To Understand the Priesthood and to value Jesus as our High Priest Heb. 9:23,24
- 2. Center of All Feasts Every celebration pointed to the coming Messiah. The Tabernacle was the center of sacrificial service to God, study, prayer, but most of all His divine presence. An example of what every home can be, a resting place for His Shechinah Glory. To help us understand the culture Jesus lived in.
- 3. To Understand the Signs of the Times Lunar Calendar began when the tabernacle was built (Exodus 12:2). It was based off of the sky reminding them God was in charge of time. Everyday the sky pointed to the next feast which pointed to the Messiah (Matt 24:3-31). Jews are longing to rebuild the temple to sacrifice as they used to. They don't believe the Messiah will return until it is rebuilt.
- 4. Part of God's Redemptive Plan was to build the Tabernacle. It was the end of exile when His Glory fell. God waited 430 years to fulfil His promise. This reflected another covenant to come Acts 2-4, Heb. 10:6. Full redemption will be fulfilled in His second coming and the millennium.
- **5. Learn Heart Postures** directing us to the Holy of Holies in prayer a shadow of what is in heaven We are His meeting place. Rev 11: 19, Rev 15:3-5










215 years in Canaan – From Abraham to Jacob who brought the Israelites to Egypt surviving the famine through Joseph his son – 12 tribes of Israel 215 years in Egypt until Moses obedience to deliver them from exile.

Shiloh -The patriarch Jacob first spoke of Shiloh on his deathbed, giving a promise to the tribe of Judah.

"The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until Shiloh comes, and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples." Genesis 49:10

After the Israelites entered the promised land, the tabernacle made its way to Shiloh, where it stood for 369 years. Joshua cast lots to divide the land putting the Ark in the Tribe of Ephraim - Joshua 18:9,10, Judges 21:19, Jer. 7:12 -14 In Shiloh the curtained walls of the tabernacle were replaced with stone, but the roof remained a covering of skins. (Zevachim 14:6) From the

time Israel entered the promised land until the time of Samuel, the Ark of the Covenant remained in the Tabernacle at Shiloh. Hannah, prayed to God about her barren womb here. She offered her son Samuel to minister before the Lord in Shiloh. 1 Samuel 1:1-28; 3:21

Ancient Israel refused to walk with God,

He abandoned the dwelling place at Shiloh, the tent which He had pitched among men, and gave up His strength to captivity and His glory into the hand of the adversary. —Psalm 78:60,61

The Philistines took the Ark and destroyed Shiloh in 1104 B.C. (1 Samuel 4:10-11). The Israelites worshiped God in the tabernacle for almost 500 years until Solomon's Temple was built. David's heart cry was fulfilled by providing a permanent house of worship for the Lord.

The First Temple (Jerusalem 1000 – 586 B.C.E.) Was built under the reign of King Solomon and destroyed by the Babylonians. The ark vanished when the **Babylonians conquered Jerusalem in 587 B.C.** The Jewish historian Josephus says that "the temple was burnt four hundred and seventy years, six months, and ten days after it was built".



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The exile was not over until the Jewish people built their Mishkan, the Tabernacle, in the Wilderness. Ramban

The Second Temple (Jerusalem 516 B.C.E. - 70 C.E.) Was built under Persian rule. It was rebuilt under great stress in the time of Ezra and Nehemiah with the help of Darius king of Medopersia. It was constructed by a number of Jewish exile groups returning from Babylon under the governor Zerubbabel. It was inferior to Solomon's temple and the one Ezekiel saw



in visions. The second temple was completely refurbished, during the reign of Herod the Great. The original structure was totally overhauled into the large and magnificent edifices and facades that Jesus would have experienced. The Second Temple had no Ark and the blood was sprinkled where the Ark would have been and the incense was put on the Brazen Altar of incense. It was destroyed by the Romans (Titus' Army) and lasted 585 years -Zech. 5-6

Lunar Calendar While the Israelites were still in slavery, God gave the people their first mitzvah (roughly translated: a precept, decree, or commandment). God informed Moses and Aaron that the upcoming new moon was distinct and He told them, "**This month shall be the beginning of months to you; it is to be the first month of the year to you" (Exodus 12:2**). Keeping this lunar-based religious calendar was significant because it required the population to deliberately watch for God's appointed times, rather than relying on any dating systems men devised.


The Tabernacle was built at the base of Mount Sinai(Ex 40:17 / 9 - 12 months)

"You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself" Exodus 19:4

Cloud by Day - Fire by Night

Angels (Ex 23:20-23, 32:34, 33:2) and the glory of God guided the Israelites to Mount Sinai - Cloud- Fire

God Lead the Israelites "by day the Lord went ahead of them in a pillar of cloud to guide them on their way and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night." Ex. 13:21 "Then the angel of God, who had been travelling in front of Israel's army, withdrew and went behind them. The pillar of cloud also moved from in front and stood behind them, coming between the armies of Egypt and Israel. Throughout the night the cloud brought darkness to the one side and light to the other side; so neither went near the other all night long." Ex. 14: 19,20

"In all the travels of the Israelites, whenever the **cloud** lifted from above the tabernacle, they would set out; but if the cloud did not lift, they did not set out—until the day it lifted. So the cloud of the Lord was over the tabernacle by day, and **fire** was in the **cloud** by night, in the sight of all the Israelites during all their travels." Ex. 40: 36-38

Gods' Sign of His Provisions "While Aaron was speaking to the whole Israelite community, they looked toward the desert, and there was the glory of the Lord appearing in the cloud." Ex. 16:10

God Welcomed Moses into the Cloud "the glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai. For six days the cloud covered the mountain, and on the seventh day the Lord called to Moses from within the cloud." Ex. 24:16

God Confirmed all was Done as He Instructed "Moses did everything just as the Lord commanded him." Ex. 40:16 "Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernac-le." Ex 40:34 - Solomon's Temple - Kings 8: 6-13

God Confirmed He was Behind Moses Leading with His Presence so that people might believe it was God speaking to Moses promoting faithfulness. Ex 19:9

A Glory Cloud rested over the Ark of the Covenant God gave instructions on how to build the ark before all other instructions so that we would never forget what the tabernacle is about - His Presence.

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"The entire Mishkan and all it's parts symbolized Mount Sinai. The glory that had rested on the mountain in an awesomely open manifestation. in a crescendo of shofar blasts and fiery holiness. would henceforth be in the Tabernacle. but in a subdued. quiet manner. Just as God spoke to Moses from the mountain so too, in the Mishkan God would come to Moses from atop the Ark, from between the two Cherubim." Rabbi Bitterman

And they shall know [from personal experience] that I am the Lord their God, Who brought them forth out of the land of Egypt that I might dwell among them: I am the
